PROJECT PURPOSE

Australians Together creates curriculum resources for Foundation through to Year 10, with the guidance of First Nations cultural advisers. Each resource aligns with the Australian Curriculum, addressing the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cross-curriculum priority and AITSL Standards 1.4 and 2.4. Our unit guides are available free of charge to all who register with us.

Over 200 resources have been written already and are available online. We aim to provide teachers with rich, engaging and culturally safe resources to support the inclusion of First Nations perspectives into their teaching content.

Each resource comprises a referenced teacher guide with a glossary, student activities including handouts for each lesson and useful resources for teaching. They're written in accordance with the Australians Together Curriculum Resource Writer's Guide, which details our language, tone, content framework and production process.

To complete this work, we engage experienced teachers with strong First Nations cultural literacy and connections.

THE ROLE

As a **Curriculum Resources Writer**, you'll work under the direction of the Product Specialist – Curriculum Resources to contribute to the expanding suite of Australians Together curriculum resources. You'll be responsible for writing and refining curriculum resources and materials that are aligned with the Australians Together guidelines and that will meet teachers' and students' needs.

To ensure the accuracy and relevance of the resources, a First Nations cultural adviser will share expertise and collaborate with you during the research and writing process.

You'll write curriculum resources that meet AITSL Teaching Standards 1.4 and 2.4 and assist teachers to deliver the Australian Curriculum's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories and Cultures cross-curriculum priority. You'll be writing for the year levels and learning areas you're most familiar with. In primary years these often have a cross- or inter-disciplinary teaching and learning approach.
